


SUPPORTIVE LIVING (ADULT CARE FACILITY) SEARCH

To search for a Residential Care Facility, often called “Assisted Living,” either click the link called “Supportive Living” or use the red menu bar at the top for “Supportive living facilities for someone with disabilities including mental illness.”



Help in deciding if I or my loved one needs long term care?

Long-term care helps meet health or personal needs and can be provided at home in the community, in supportive living facilities like adult care homes, in assisted living or in nursing homes. Please use the Consumer Guide to search for and compare nursing homes, residential care (assisted living) facilities, and supportive living facilities and to learn more about services in your home and community that may meet your needs.

At any time during your search, if you want to switch the type of home to review, just choose a different facility type using the top menu bar. Other facility types include:

- **Nursing Homes.** Licensed as nursing homes by the state and/or certified for Medicaid/Medicare by the federal government, these residences provide personal care, such as assistance with eating, bathing, grooming and personal hygiene and nursing care. Some offer more extensive rehabilitation on a short- or long-term basis.
- **Assisted Living (RCFs).** Licensed as Residential Care Facilities, these residences generally provide meals, housekeeping, laundry, transportation, and social activities. They also offer personal care, such as assistance with eating, bathing, grooming and personal hygiene. Some nursing care may also be provided.
- **Residential Treatment Facilities.** These rooms and board to persons with mental illness. They all require a referral from a hospital, mental health agency or practitioner.

After choosing to search for Supportive Living, the site will display a page titled “Supportive Living Facilities.” The page has a great deal of information to help you in your search – tips on selecting a home, how they’re licensed, how to pay for care and who to call for help in selecting or to report a problem.

To begin your search, click the red button called “[Click here to search for Supportive Living Facilities.](#)”

TIP: If you frequently search for supportive living homes, this might be a good page to bookmark to return in the future.



Supportive Living Facilities

Supportive Living Facilities, also known as Adult Care Facilities, serve those with disabilities, including physical, mental or behavioral health needs.

There are over 750 supportive living facilities in Ohio. Supportive living facilities provide room, board and personal care for individuals who need assistance with daily living. Residents may have a variety of disabilities, including mental illness. These homes may be a good option for persons who want to maintain some level of independence and don't require hospitalization or nursing home care, but still may need assistance with daily living such as meals, housekeeping, and medication management. Facilities are operated and staffed by either an agency or a home owner. Facilities that serve residents with serious mental illness are required to have their staff annually trained in the care and supervision of the needs of these residents.

These homes are licensed by the [Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services](#) for the purpose of providing accommodations, supervision and personal care services to unrelated adults. Facilities receive a two-year license to operate and must undergo a comprehensive onsite inspection of the home in which inspectors verify the safe and sanitary condition of the facility, the capability of the operator and staff to meet their responsibilities in providing supervision and personal care services and the appropriateness of the placement of each resident in the adult care setting.

Search Reset

The facility search page will allow you to search for a facility by Geography and by the services available in the facility. The Type of facility will already be marked for “Supportive Living.” You may wish to search by county, by the city, or by the distance to your zip code.

We recommend you choose one search type at a time – not all three – to ensure you get sufficient responses to review. If you’re in a rural area, start with a county search; in a large city, you may want to start with 5 to 10 miles from your zip code. To search by zip code, simply enter your 5 digit zip code into this box, then drag the marker to the left or right to increase or decrease the distance for your search.


If you have a few homes in mind already, you may wish to enter the names here in the Keyword Search box, separated by a comma. Use few of the words in the name – for instance, type “Happy Hills” for Happy Hills Home.

On the lower left, the “Population Served” drop down box will allow you to choose homes that serve particular populations like Men, Women or Families. If a facility has not logged onto the site and indicated which population they serve, no results will appear if you search by these criteria.

Some nursing home residents seeking to participate in the HOME Choice program may wish to use the “4 or fewer beds” check box to search for homes that may be eligible residences after leaving the nursing home. The bed count is based on the home’s license with the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services.



The right hand side lists services that the facilities may or may not offer. If a facility has not logged onto the site and entered services, no results will appear if you search by these criteria. Keep in mind, these are services the facility has indicated they offer; verify any information with a home before making decisions about long term care.


